<u>Year l</u>

It has been such a lovely week in Year I! The children have been working really well and trying their best in everything that they do - I couldn't ask for anything more! In our maths work, we have been using our hands and feet to measure and compare objects in our classroom. We finished our history topic on transport by looking at how trains have changed over time and also about the first moon landing! In English, we enjoyed designing and creating leaflets to advertise the bear's latest concert and we have been working hard on our phonics every day too! It was lovely to see so many of our families at the Phonics Screening Check meeting on Friday this week. If you have any questions about the check please ask. Have a lovely weekend!

<u>Year 2</u>

It has been a short but lovely week in Year 2. The children have been working very hard preparing for their SATs. In maths, we have continued comparing the properties of 2D and 3D shapes. We have also been revisiting our work on multiplication and division. In English, we have completed our newspaper report on 'Fantastic Mr. Fox'. I am so impressed with how the children's writing has matured over the last few weeks. In P.H.S.E. we talked about how we might raise money to help good causes. I even received a few letters from children asking if Year 2 could raise money for charity! Please remember that we are in a statutory assessment period and attendance is very important. Year 3

A short but busy week in Year 3! In maths, we have constructed right angles, acute and obtuse angles. It was a pleasure reading children's biographies in English all about David Walliams. We have also covered work on using personal pronouns. In science we had great fun investigating how the height of a light source and distance of an object from a light source affects the size, position and shape of a shadow. We finished our science topic by learning about Thomas Edison and his great invention of the light bulb. In geography, we researched facts about Italy and described the land. The children who going to our residential visit to Waddow Hall must arrive in school at normal time so we can leave on time. Have a lovely weekend!

<u>Year 4</u>

A short but great week in Year 4! In maths, we have continued to look at area and perimeter, we even calculated the area of the different rooms inside the Taj Mahal! In English, we have been focusing on the theme of 'action' and how we can build suspense in our writing. In science, we have really enjoyed classifying the organisms found in our local environment (our school playground), creating our own classification key. We finished our science topic by learning about how humans both positively and negatively impact the environment. In geography, we located various rivers using atlases and identified: the source, mouth and the countries on course. Have a lovely Bank Holiday weekend Year 4, you have all worked hard!

P.E. AT ST AMBROSE

This week in P.E., Early Years continued learning about speed, agility and travel and focused on how to change direction quickly and safely. In gymnastics with Year I, we focused on a range of balances, trying out lots of one-foot actions. Year 2 worked on how to stop the ball during attack, defend and shoot games. Anxiety is one of the most common mental health problems we can face. Lots of things can lead to feelings of anxiety, including exam pressures, relationships, starting a new job (or losing one) or other big life events. We can also get anxious when it comes to things to do with money and not being able to meet our basic needs, like heating our home or buying food, For example, in the current cost-of-living crisis, more than a third of adults feel anxious about their financial situation. But it's important that we recognise and respond when we feel anxious, so that our anxiety doesn't become overwhelming
