Nursery

We started our week with an exciting visit from Santa's elves to collect the letters we have been busy writing. We have been practising the songs for our Christmas Nativity and working very hard to remember the actions. Please encourage your children to practise at home too. As the weather is becoming colder, we have been speaking about how the water outside turns to ice. We conducted an experiment by filling one of our trays up with water before dropping plastic bears in. The next day, it had frozen and the bears were trapped! We created art by painting the ice with water colours, it looked beautiful. In Collective Worship, we have spoken about Advent, and our theme was 'waiting'. We made our own Christingles to take home.

Reception

Reception have loved getting into the Christmas spirit! This week we have been busy crafting - making our own baubles for the St Ambrose church tree and also decorating our classroom windows. Collective Worship has been focused on Advent and together we have spent time talking about 'waiting' and what this means for us. We thought about all of the things we have to wait for, as well as waiting for the coming of Christ. On Friday, we celebrated the Feast of St. Ambrose. Year I

What a fantastic week in Year I! The children have had such fun in their learning both in and out of the classroom! They have completed short quizzes in maths and English this week and I have been really impressed by the progress that they have shown.

We loved our visit to John Lennon Airport on Tuesday afternoon and we learned all about how the airport has changed over the years, as well as watching the different planes taking off and land. This will stand us in good stead when we start our 'Transport' topic after Christmas. On Friday, we loved finding out about our new mission, and celebrating St Ambrose Feast Day with our whole school family. Remember to keep on reading at home and have a lovely weekend everyone!

Year 2

We have had a really exciting week in Year 2! We were historians for the day during our Kings and Queens workshop. We were transported to different eras of the monarchy of Great Britain, and enjoyed role-playing and drama using props and artefacts. We have completed assessments this week and I am so proud of the resilience and effort all children have shown. In maths, we have been dividing using equal groups and used our inverse to check. Thank you to the children who completed their food diaries homework in science. We used them to evaluate if we are eating the right amount of food types in order to be healthy. Today, we celebrated the launch our new Mission Statement by planting seeds and making seeds collages.

Year 3

We have completed another wonderful week of learning in Year 3. This week the children completed their end of term assessments in reading and maths.

I am very proud of the resilience shown by the children and how they all tried their best. In English we explored our characters actions and choices in more depth. We held a class debate and I was impressed with the sophisticated opinions formed and the counter arguments put forward. In maths, we began our new topic 'Length and Perimeter' explored length in millimetres, centimetres and metres. On Friday, we celebrated St Ambrose Feast Day and the launch of our mission by considering how we can live like Jesus. Have a fantastic weekend everyone.

Year 4

The first week of December is here and the children have been working so hard in the run up to Christmas. In English, we have identified the features of dialogue in a narrative and developed our understanding on how this can impact the reader. We have consolidated our learning in maths, revisiting multiplication facts and bar charts. I have been so impressed with their knowledge

for both topics. In science, we conducted an investigation on 'States of Matter' to identify the melting points of various solids. During our music lesson with Mr. Watson, we practised for the Carol Concert at the end of term. The children love singing all the Christmas songs; they have made great progress this term. Finally, on Friday we celebrated St Ambrose Feast Day by wearing yellow and black whilst completing a range of activities linked to our new school mission.

P.E. AT ST AMBROSE

This week in P.E., Key Stage I focused on stepping, hopping and jumping with control and different shapes! They added these together to create sequences. Years 3 and 4 worked on composing a sequence using the different elements they have learnt throughout their topic and Years 5 and 6 both adapted their sequences to include changes of speed and varying levels. We sang our hearts out to all of our Christmas songs, that we have been practising with Mr. Watson. On Thursday, we wore our pyjamas to our swimming lesson. We learnt all about water-safety and how to help somebody if they come into danger in open water.
