ARBOR

As we move towards reducing our paper use as a school, it is essential that you continue to engage with the Arbor app. On Arbor, you should make payments for things such as; school meals, class trips and year group residentials. We also now use Arbor to gather consent for educational visits and will no longer be sending home return slips of paper for you to sign. Without your consent, your children will not be able to attend class trips, and we do not have the staff capacity to constantly ring home to ask for consent. Please ensure that all email addresses are fully up to date.

OPAL

We are now approximately 15 months into our OPAL journey. OPAL stands for Outdoor Play and Learning and our aim is to give every child an hour of excellent quality play each day, regardless of the weather. A reminder that all children should have WELLIES and a WARM, WATERPROOF coat in school each day. We are happy to store the wellies in school Please make sure all items have the child's name inside. Over Christmas, it would be great if you could look for any of the following loose parts and bring them to school during the first week back:

- suitcases
- cable drums
- wooden pallets
- fabric (sheets/saris/curtains)
- plastic crates, bins or boxes (any size)
- old keyboards/mobile phones/torches/calculators/laptops/kettles
 - anything made from foam (not polystyrene)
